What a week it has been! I would like to begin by thanking all staff, pupils, and their families for such a warm welcome to Meadowdale Academy. It has been great to see so many pupils coming into school with huge smiles on their faces, eager for the day ahead!

The week began with Meadowdale's Attendance assembly; I was impressed to see four classes had achieved the school's attendance target of 96%. Pupils in each of the classes enjoyed a delicious treat! I hope to see even more classes achieving next week.

Throughout the week, I was set a challenge by pupils: to learn their names at rapid rate. Each day, I have been tested on my memory skills, which have proved quite a concern at times! Through their rigorous quizzing, I am learning day-by-day all of the wonderful pupils' names at Meadowdale Academy. Over the coming weeks and term, I hope to have achieved a 100% pass rate.

Inquisitive Owlets!

The owlets absolutely love books. This half term our focus book is 'Hairy Maclary.' We also enjoyed another book based on the children's interest this week - 'Here comes crocodile.'

We provided props to encourage the children to retell the story from memory. Taking part in this activity improves concentration, memory, and helps build oral language.



Pre-school Rummaging Robins!

The Robins have been reading "Little Red Riding Hood" this week. We have made sandwiches for the picnic and put on a puppet show. Some of the children made Little Red Riding Hood some extra picnic snacks using the playdough. A few of the Robins decided to make their own costumes and dress up as super-heroes.



Perfect Puffins!

The Puffins continue to thrive in Reception and are now quite accomplished palaeontologists! We have been learning how fossils are created, using and understanding wondrous words such as extinct and predator, and even learning about sedimentary rock and erosion. If you pass a Puffin, ask them what a 'thagomizer' is, you'll be amazed at how much they know!



In Maths we have begun measuring in the classroom, investigating objects that are longer or shorter than the length of our arm – it was great to see the children take this learning into their continuous provision following their adult led task. Some Puffins even took their string home with them to continue their measuring.

We are loving our reading and phonics, a highlight of continuous provision has been the children leading their own Pinny Time with their apron, speed sound cards and of course, not forgetting, Fred.

Curious Kingfishers!

As always, our Kingfishers have been hard at work this week. They were very excited in Monday's assembly to receive a trophy to add to their notice board for excellent attendance!

This week we have been striking a pose in PE as we improve our balance and flexibility in gymnastics and yoga. Our Kingfishers impressed me with their perseverance with some tricky stretches!

In our geography lessons begun our learning all about the United Kingdom and revisited compass directions to help us describe the locations of the four countries: England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland.

We used our scientist hats to investigate objects and their materials – there was lots of discussion using the words: 'absorb', 'waterproof' and 'transparent' when we discussed why certain materials were good choices to make certain objects. For example: we decided that rubber was a good choice for wellies because it is waterproof and so would keep our feet dry!

Writing lessons this week are focussed on writing instructions. We have been using bossy verbs to write command sentences and thinking about the importance of clear instructions. We had some giggles when we saw what happened when instructions weren't clear enough!

In maths we have been working on adding by counting on and using the part while model to help us. We've been working on using the vocabulary: 'part', 'whole', 'altogether', 'plus' and 'equal to'.



Shining Skylarks!

In writing this week we have been using subheadings to organise our non-fiction writing about hibernation. We enjoyed practising using alliteration in our sentences and found some alliterative tongue twisters really tricky! We have now come to the end of our addition and subtraction topic in maths and have been consolidating our learning. We are looking forward to moving on to our new topic of multiplication.

In science, the Skylarks visited the computing room where they worked in pairs to research one of the world's habitats – artic, desert, ocean or rainforest. We found out about some really unusual animals such as flying squirrels, poisonous tree frogs and blob fish. We also learnt about Chinese New Year this week and had fun opening and reading our fortune cookies - Xīnnián hǎo (Good New Year).

Super Swifts

The Swifts have had a busy week with lots of changes and they have worked hard to adapt to these. In maths, they are working on consolidating their multiplication knowledge and understanding of the structure of multiplication. In Geography, they learnt about Mary Anning and how she discovered the fossils of dinosaurs on the south coast of England.

We also welcomed Miss Bartlett and a few other new members to our class this week: Gerald, Charlie, Messi, Freddy and Wednesday. In Science, Swifts built their own skeleton using their scientific knowledge and couldn't resist naming them. Next week, we will look at the names for the bones to build on this learning.




Heroic Harriers
