This week the Robins have been working together to complete tasks and showing great resilience. They have also been sharing some of their favourite stories with each other. The children have been learning about Shrove Tuesday and made some paper pancakes with their favourite toppings.

The Puffins have had an absolutely amazing half term, and have finished it off this week with some fantastic learning.

In Maths we have enjoyed revisiting our learning about measuring. The Puffins have investigated with 30cm rulers, meter rules and even snakes! We also used cubes to measure dinosaurs, discussing which one was the tallest and which was the shortest.









The Puffins have continued to embed, enhance and apply their learning about dinosaurs, creating dinosaurs using playdough and adding texture with a variety of tools.





We enjoyed our last dinosaur themed text in Literacy, Tyrannosaurus Drip, which led to some absolutely outstanding independent writing.



The Puffins are looking forward to a well-earned week at home with their families over half term, but we know they will all be taking their learning home too!

Curious Kingfishers!

What a great half term filled with busy, busy bees in Kingfisher class!

In this last week, we have been writing traditional stories in English and using adjectives to describe our characters. We were saddened to hear that the other animals in 'The Ugly Duckling' were mean to the duckling because he was different. Our caring Kingfishers had a very positive discussion about respecting and celebrating all of our differences and unique qualities.

We have developed a deeper understanding of part whole models and how they can help us solve a whole variety of maths problems – we completed a mind challenge involving a very complicated diagram – our Kingfishers are expert mathematicians in the making! In geography, we have completed our lessons about the United Kingdom and its capitals and we zoomed in on London using satellite images and maps. We can't wait to find out more about our capital city.



The Skylarks have enjoyed another great week of learning! We have begun our new science topic learning all about animals and their off spring. We found that matching some animals to their offspring was really quite tricky! We are looking forward to visiting the farm in the Spring to see newly born lambs.

In maths this week we have been applying our multiplication knowledge and using it to solve word problems, Some Skylarks even wrote their own word problem – impressive!

In history this week we made our very own Bayeux Tapestry and learnt all about the key events in the life of William the Conqueror.











Super Swifts!

This week Year 3 have continued their descriptive writing and have been working on using persuasive techniques. In RE, they wrote a prayer, thinking about what they would pray for themselves, their families and their communities. In Science, they have continued their work on the body, experimenting to find out which muscles they use when performing different physical activities.

Heroic Harriers!

As we come to the end of half term, we are still working hard in the Harriers. We have become experts at finding the perimeter of shapes. We have looked at rectangles, rectilinear shapes, regular and irregular polygons and can even identify missing sides! In science, we have been looking at evaporation and how clothes dry after they have been washed. We wet tea towels and left in them various locations around school to dry. We found out that in warmer locations, the water evaporates quicker.

Marvellous Merlins!

The Merlins have been learning about Emperor Penguins in the Antarctic in their English lessons. We learned about how the baby penguin is kept in the mother's or father's brood pouch so it does not touch the ice, so we tried it ourselves... here are the Merlins trying to pass the ball around with their feet without touching the ice. What fantastic teamwork!





Outstanding Owls!

The Owls have had a fantastic half term and should feel really proud of themselves for the progress they have made in their reading, writing and maths. This week they have perfected their formation in gymnastics and completed their programming in computing. Well done to you all.
