1. Introduction

Meadowdale Academy is part of the North East Learning Trust and the uniform policy supports the high standards of the Trust and the Academy. At Meadowdale Academy we believe that a school uniform plays an important role in creating a focused and respectful learning environment. Our uniform policy is designed to promote equality, reduce distractions, and instil a sense of pride and belonging among pupils. By wearing the correct uniform, pupils represent not only themselves but also the values and community of our school. This policy outlines the expectations for pupil dress and appearance, ensuring consistency and clarity for all members of the school community.

2. Aims

We believe that a clearly defined clearly Academy uniform is important because it:

Promotes Equality

To create a sense of fairness and reduce peer pressure by minimising visible economic and social differences among pupils.

Encourages a Sense of Belonging

To help pupils feel part of the school community and take pride in representing their school.

• Supports a Focused Learning Environment

To reduce distractions and support a professional atmosphere that is conducive to learning and achievement.

• Enhances Safety and Security

To ensure pupils are easily identifiable as members of the school, both on-site and during off-site activities, improving overall safety.

• Fosters Discipline and Responsibility

To encourage pupils to take responsibility for their appearance and to understand the importance of following guidelines and expectations.

• Prepares Students for the Future

To help pupils develop habits of personal presentation that are important in many workplaces and formal environments.

The school uniform requirements are outlined in the table below, along with details regarding which items are optional and which need to be branded.

PE Kit

Bottoms	Required	Plain black shorts, tracksuit bottoms or leggings. Note: It is required for students to have at least one of these items.
Hoodie	Required	Royal blue hoodie with or without Meadowdale logo. Note: Available from the uniform supplier or any high street retailer.
Meadowdale Academy Gym Bag/Small Drawstring Bag	Optional	

Pupils attending swimming lessons with school should come to school in their Meadowdale PE kit. Pupils must wear swimming shorts, a one-piece swimming costume or a shorts wetsuit; bikinis are not permitted. Children may wear a lightweight t-shirt over their swim wear if they wish.

Nursery

Children have the option to wear a navy blue sweatshirt/cardigan, white polo shirt and grey trousers or knee-length skirt. Items can be purchased with or without the school badge.

- indoor black shoes
- wellies or outdoor shoes that are kept in school for playtime (required daily for outdoor learning)
- warm, waterproof coat (required daily for outdoor learning)

General Appearance

Hair/Headwear	Long hair should be tied back. Hairbands and bobbles should be plain black or purple, extreme hair accessories are not permitted. Hair dye and coloured streaks are not permitted. No shaven hair designs.
	Religious head coverings are permitted and can be purchased from Emblematic.
Jewellery	Only one stud earring in each ear lobe and a watch are permitted. No other jewellery is permitted, including nose piercings. Watches and earrings must be removed for PE lessons – this is the responsibility of parents/carers to remove these before school if pupils are unable to remove them themselves.
Make-Up/Nails	Nail varnish and nails extension are not permitted in school. Make up is not allowed.

The Academy reserves the right to make the final decision on what is acceptable and what is not acceptable.

Pre-Loved School Uniform

In an effort to ensure affordability and ease the financial pressures involved in purchasing uniform for our parents/guardians and their families, we have established a 'Pre-Loved School Uniform Shop'. This is also a means of reducing the amount of clothing that is wasted and sent to landfill, thus protecting the environment, and reducing our carbon footprint. 4. Role of the Local Academy Council

The Local Academy Council will determine, monitor, and review the Uniform Policy and provide support and guidance to the Headteacher to ensure that the policy is implemented and adhered to.

5. Role of the Headteacher

- To ensure that pupils comply with the uniform policy.
- To enforce the school uniform throughout the school community, as part of the duty within maintenance of day-to-day discipline in the school.
- Speak with parents/carers of pupils who persistently do not wear the correct uniform.
- Follow DfE guidelines where a pupil fails to comply with the Uniform Policy.

6. Role of staff

- To set a good example in terms of dress.
- To remind children to wear school uniform. The class teacher will speak to pupils who do not wear correct uniform and if this persists the matter will be referred to the Headteacher.

7. Role of the parents/carers

- To ensure that their child/children adhere to the school's uniform policy and come to school in uniform everyday unless there are special circumstances such as non- uniform days.
- To ensure that all uniform is labelled correctly and clearly.

8. Breaches of the uniform policy

Pupils are expected to wear school uniform unless there is a justified reason, they are unable to. Parents/carers must inform the school in writing, clearly stating the reasons, should their child be unable to wear any aspect of the uniform.

The Headteacher will decide what action to take should a pupil's appearance be judged not to comply with the Uniform Policy. If a pupil arrives at school dressed inappropriately, they will be asked to wear a spare school uniform for the rest of day or remove anything which does not comply with the Uniform Policy.
